#### **SPRING EVENT ABSENCES:**

Each spring, the HS Principal's office gives out a reminder in this newsletter as to what will be excused when it comes to attending track meets or other spring events. Our student handbook allows the following: "WILL BE EXCUSED...... illness, work at home (if we have a parent request in advance), attending the State Fair, going on trips with parents (such as skiing trips), and going to NSAA sponsored events (as in State Wrestling, Basketball, Track, Speech, Music, and the One Acts) if you are a participant or if transportation is sponsored by the school. Any other activity, other than those noted above, will be UNEXCUSED unless cleared IN ADVANCE with the School's Administration. The HS Principal's office is NOT going to excuse students from school to attend all-day track meets. I would also like to remind parents that an excused absence is a still an absence and will be counted against a student's total days missed.

# WARMER WEATHER AND THE DRESS CODE:

Each year at about this time, it is necessary to remind parents and students about our school's dress code, especially when it gets a little warm outside. Chances are pretty good that some students will try to wear SKIMPY or INAPPROPRIATE summer type clothes to school sometime this spring. Meridian Public School Board of Education met on March 17, 2014, as per notice Fairbury Journal News.

President Wolfe called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. The open meeting law information was presented. Members present were Jackson, Frank, Miller, Mussman, VanWesten, and Wolfe. Also present were Superintendent Gade, Principal Mans, Lori Hofstetter, Erin VanderSchaaf, Randy Kort and Rene' Scheer.

Mussman moved and Frank seconded to approve the change to the agenda by adding the Principal Contract at 11.5 and at 11.75 an Area Activity Sub-Committee assignment. Vote taken: Miller-aye, Frank-aye, Mussman-aye, Jackson-aye, Wolfe-aye, and VanWesten -aye. Motion carried 6-0.

Frank moved and Miller seconded to approve consent agenda as follows:

Jackson moved and Miller seconded to approve a Band trip for the summer of 2015 to Chicago. Vote taken: Jacksonaye, Miller-aye, Frank-aye, Mussmanaye, Wolfe-aye, and VanWesten-aye. Motion carried 6-0.

The Board discussed a change in the school calendar for the 2013-2014 school year. No motion was made.

The Board gave Superintendent Gade a directive to equalize pay for Rene' Scheer as substitute head speech coach.

Mussman moved and Miller seconded to approve the second reading of Policy Series 5000 (Students). The 5000 series includes; admission and attendance, student discipline, academic reporting and progress, student activities, EEO/welfare, transportation, and emergency protocol. Frank moved and VanWesten seconded to approve the first reading of Policy Series 7000 (New Construction). The 7000 series includes: planning, guidelines for building and remodeling, selection of architect/engineer, financing, bids, awarding contracts, and change orders. Vote taken: Mussman-aye, Miller-aye, Frank-aye, Jackson-aye, Wolfe-aye, and VanWesten-aye. Motion carried 6-0.

VanWesten moved and Mussman seconded to increase the rate of pay for the non-certified staff by 3% for the 2014-2015 school year. Vote taken: VanWesten-aye, Miller-aye, Jacksonaye, Frank-aye, Mussman-aye, and Wolfe-aye. Motion carried 6-0.

Mussman moved and Frank seconded to approve Principal Mans' contract for the 2014-2015 school year and increased her salary by \$5,253. Vote taken: Jackson-aye, Miller-aye, VanWesten-aye, Frank-aye, Mussmanaye, Wolfe-aye. Motion carried 6-0.

Miller moved and Frank seconded to appoint Frank and VanWesten to an Area Activity Sub-Committee. Vote taken: VanWesten-aye, Miller-aye, Jackson-aye, Frank-aye, Mussman-aye, Wolfe-aye. Motion carried 6-0.

The Board discussed whether Ecigarettes fell within the Tobacco Policy. It was determined that Ecigarettes fell within the Tobacco Policy and the Safe Schools Policy and no changes needed to be made at this time.

The Board discussed facility improvements including the roof, HVAC system, and the issue of high radon readings. The building and grounds committee will schedule a walk through.

appointments will need to be made before August 1, 2014. Students must bring all physical forms with their name, date of birth, and medical history as instructed on each form. These forms also require a parent/guardian signature. Without these properly completed forms, students will need to reschedule their appointment. The cost of each physical is \$65.00 plus \$8.00 if a UA is required by the school (Kindergarten and 7th Grade). For UA's please pick up a sample cup ahead of time and bring it with you for the appointment.

**Gage County Medical Clinic** For established patients ONLY: Please call 402-228-3436 to schedule your appointment ahead of time with our office. Physicals will be offered at a reduced rate of \$45.00 (includes exam, UA dip, and hemoglobin test). You will need to have written consent if you are not accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. # PARENT TEEN DRIVERFACT SHEET Parents play a key

Parents play a key role when it comes to keeping their teen safe on the road.

## Why teens crash

eens don't get into a crash because they don't know the basic rules of the road. Rather it is because of their inexperience, immaturity and driving in high-risk situations. Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death for Nebraska teens.









### What can parents do?

#### Be involved with your teen driver.



Involved parents who set rules and monitor their teen's driving behavior in a supportive way can lower their teen's

crash risk by half. Setting rules can be done through parent-teen driving agreements. These agreements help set clear driving guidelines/rules and allow for adjustments in driving privileges based on a teen's driving experience, judgment and overall safe driving.

#### ⇒ Be a good role model.

Drive the way you would want your teen to drive. Buckle up, don't use a cell phone while driving and obey traffic laws.

#### ⇒ Learn about the Nebraska Graduated Driver Licensing (GDL) laws.

GDL laws work in reducing teen driver crashes because they keep teens out of high-risk driving situations such as nighttime driving, driving distracted (cell phones and teen passengers), drinking and driving as well as requiring the use of a seat belt. Utilize these laws to protect your teen driver.

#### Practice driving.

Teen drivers need many hours of driving practice and need to gain driving experience on various roadway types and in different environments. Continue to drive with your teen even after they get their license as that should not be the only indicator that they have developed all the driving skills they need.



It takes years to become an expert at something and driving is no different.

#### Limit primary access to a vehicle.

Teens who are the main driver of a vehicle are more than twice as likely to report to having been in a crash as teens who share a car. If you choose to provide your teen with his or her own car, buy one with safety in mind. 
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
