Meridian Public School Board of Education met on March 16, 2015, as per notice in the Fairbury Journal-News.

President VanWesten called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. The open meeting law information was presented. Members present were Sobotka, Frank, Miller, Scheer, Vorderstrasse, and VanWesten. Also present were Superintendent Kort, Principal Scott, Matt Mittan, Marilyn Bachle, Robert Bachle, Ty Brakhage, and McKehna Bartels.

Frank moved Miller seconded to approve consent agenda as follows:

I have been meeting individually with students in grades 6-11 to get an idea of the classes they are interested in. Once a schedule is set for next year, students will have a chance to finalize their selections. As a reminder, all Meridian students need 4 years of English and Social Studies, 3 years of Math and Science, 2 years of Fine Arts, 1 year each of Technology, Physical Education, and Vocational or Foreign Language. Parents, please be sure to discuss your student's plan for the upcoming year.

Once again, next year's Junior and Senior students will have an opportunity to take dual-credit online college classes. Certain requirements to participate in these classes do apply. Right now, we utilize college resources through Peru State and Southeast



Community College. Students also have an opportunity to participate in SENCAP's Career Academy, which is a great way to earn college credits free of charge! Students have been informed of these offerings. Parents, if you have questions regarding this, please talk to your child or feel free to contact me.

Just a reminder that many local scholarships are due **APRIL 15th**. The application forms for all scholarships are found on the school website under the "Counselor" tab. Be sure to follow directions and complete all steps of each application.

Also, you need to let me know of any scholarships you receive – whether you accept them or not. All of the scholarships you receive will be announced at graduation.

If you haven't completed the FAFSA yet, now is the time to do so! Remember, the FAFSA will provide you with a Student Aid Report, which will determine your financial aid eligibility for next year.

Some of you have taken the opportunity this spring to visit a college of interest. I would encourage more of you to do this if you can find time around spring events. I can schedule the visit for you, though some colleges like you to submit a request from their website. When you visit, remember to take a "Campus Visit Form" with you so the office can mark it as an excused absence.

ACTIONS DAY

On Wednesday, March 18th, twenty five Meridian high school students attended ACTIONS Day at Central Community College in Hastings, Nebraska. ACTIONS Day is an academic competition for which students were recommended by their classroom teachers. Each year over 900 students from eastern Nebraska complete in over forty subject areas. Each student must take two tests, but may opt to take three. Every test has 100 multiple choice questions. Tie breaker questions are built into the tests. Tests are scored by adding the raw percentile score with the accuracy percentile score. Awards are given to the top five winners in each test area immediately after the competition.

2015-2016 PRE-K

Children who reach the age of four by July 31st, 2015, qualify for Pre-K for the 2015-2016 school year. If your child fits these parameters, please contact Mr. Kort, Mrs. Paul, or Judy Grummert at 402-446-7265. Remember, you DO NOT need to Option Enroll Pre-K students.

IMMUNIZATION & PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS

All students entering Kindergarten and Seventh Grade are required by law to have a physical and up-to-date immunizations prior to entering the 2015 -2016 school year. Kindergarten students must also have an eye exam completed before the start of school.

All Junior High and High School students who intend on participating in ANY athletics or cheerleading are required to have a current physical on file. The physical form needs to include a Clearance Waiver. Current forms for physicals and waivers will be available in the District Office or online within the month of March.

The **Fairbury Clinic** will be offering sports physicals to students of any grade by appointment. Please call 402-729-3361 to schedule your appointment. Sports physicals need to be scheduled **prior to July 15, 2015**. **Students must bring ALL forms with their name and date of birth on each as indicated, including the medical history form filled out with the child's name and birth date on each form as indicated.** These also need to be signed by a parent or guardian. The forms are available at Meridian's District Office. **If a student arrives at the Fairbury Clinic without these completed forms, they will need to reschedule their appointment.** The price will be \$65.00 for the physical and an additional \$8.00 for a urine analysis, if required. Urine



analysis are required for 7th Grade and Kindergarten physicals. If a UA is required, please pick up a sterile urine cup ahead of time at the Fairbury Clinic and bring it with you to the appointment with your child's name on it. The Fairbury Clinic also submits physicals to insurance if you would like them to do so.

Students from Kindergarten through 12 th Grade, including all transfer students from outside the State of Nebraska and any foreign students	<p>3 doses of DTaP, DTP, DT, or Td vaccine, one given on or after the 4th birthday, 3 doses of Polio vaccine, 3 doses of pediatric Hepatitis B vaccine or 2 doses of adolescent vaccine if student is 11-15 years of age. 2 doses of MMR or MMRV vaccine, given on or after 12 months of age and separated by at least one month, 2 doses of varicella (chickenpox) or MMRV given on or after 12 months of age. Written documentation (including year) of varicella disease from parent, guardian, or health care provider will be accepted. If the child has had varicella disease, they do not need any varicella shots.</p>
Additionally, for 7 th Grade Only	1 dose of Tdap (must contain Pertussis booster)

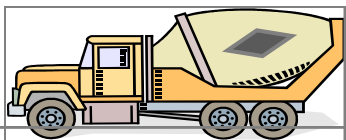
