Meridian Public School Board of Education met on January 19, 2015, as per notice in the Fairbury Journal-News.

President Wolfe called the meeting to order at 7:35 p.m. The open meeting law information was presented. Members present were Miller, Scheer, Frank, VanWesten, and Wolfe. Also present were Superintendent Kort, Principal Scott, new Board Members Scott Sobotka and Todd Vorderstrasse, and guests Erin VanderSchaaf, Shelby Homolka and Crystal Nuñez.

Scheer moved and Miller seconded to appoint current Secretary VanWesten to preside over the meeting. Vote taken: Miller-aye, Frank-aye, Scheer-aye, and VanWesten-aye. Motion carried 4-0.

Newly elected member, Scott Sobotka, recited the oath of office.

Newly elected member, Todd Vorderstrasse, recited the oath of office.

Frank moved and Miller seconded to approve Superintendent Kort to preside over the process to elect a president.



Scholarship time is here! The list of local scholarships is posted on my website under the "Counselor" tab. Click on the link that says "go here to my website." From there, find the Scholarship tab and they will all be listed. Make sure you 'download' the documents and save them to your computer so they stay formatted correctly. I have included a local checklist on my page to help you keep track of each scholarship and the requirements. This document is only for your benefit and does not need turned into me. Please notice due dates and requirements for each scholarship. Do not wait until the last minute to start these!

It's also FAFSA time! If you're a college-bound senior, you must complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) to apply for state, federal and college-based financial aid. Submit the form before your college's FAFSA priority date as some financial aid is awarded first-come, first-served. Priority dates usually fall between March 1 and April 1. To learn your college's priority date, check the financial aid section of their website or contact their financial aid office. Go to https://fafsa.ed.gov/ to apply.

Juniors & Parents:

All Juniors have started the John Baylor ACT Test Prep program in preparation for a spring ACT test. If you missed the registration deadline for this test, please note that the next test is April 18th. To register, go online to www.actstudent.org.

Boys & Girls State will be held May 31-June 6 this year. If you are a junior or have a junior student, please know that the opportunity to attend this leadership program is available. Area legion posts choose their representatives. If you have questions, please contact me.

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
