Meridian Public School Board of Education met on January 18, 2016, as per notice in the Fairbury Journal-News.

President VanWesten called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. The open meeting law information was presented. Members present were Vorderstrasse, Miller, Sobotka, Bartels, Scheer, and VanWesten. Also present were Superintendent Kort, Principal Scott, and guests Andi Kort, Mr. Smiley, and Ms. Ruiz.

Sobotka moved and Miller seconded to approve Superintendent Kort to preside over the process to elect a president. Vote taken: Vorderstrasse-aye, Milleraye, Sobotka-aye, Bartels-aye, Scheeraye, and VanWesten-aye. Motion carried 6-0.

Miller moved and Sobotka seconded to nominate VanWesten as Board President.

Scheer moved and Bartels seconded to cease nominations. Vote taken: Vorderstrasse-aye, Miller-aye, Sobotkaaye, Bartels-aye, Scheer-aye, and VanWesten-aye. Motion carried 6-0.

Scheer moved and Miller seconded to approve newly elected President VanWesten to preside over the meeting. Vote taken: Vorderstrasse-aye, Milleraye, Sobotka-aye, Bartels-aye, Scheeraye, and VanWesten-aye. Motion carried 6-0.

Miller moved and Sobotka seconded to nominate Vorderstrasse as Board Vice-President.

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Scheer moved and Bartels seconded to cease nominations. Vote taken: Vorderstrasse-aye, Miller-aye, Sobotkaaye, Bartels-aye, Scheer-aye, and VanWesten-aye. Motion carried 6-0. Vorderstrasse was elected Vice-President.

Miller moved and Bartels seconded to nominate Sobotka as Board Secretary.

Scheer moved and Bartels seconded to cease nominations. Vote taken: Vorderstrasse-aye, Miller-aye, Sobotkaaye, Bartels-aye, Scheer-aye, and VanWesten-aye. Motion carried 6-0. Sobotka was elected as Board Secretary.

Vorderstrasse moved and Sobotka seconded to nominate Miller as Board Treasurer.

Bartels moved and Sobotka seconded to cease nominations. Vote taken: Vorderstrasse-aye, Miller-aye, Sobotkaaye, Bartels-aye, Scheer-aye, and VanWesten-aye. Motion carried 6-0. Miller was elected as Board Treasurer.

Sobotka moved and Vorderstrasse seconded to approve the consent agenda as follows:

Vote taken: Vorderstrasse-aye, Milleraye, Sobotka-aye, Bartels-aye, Scheeraye, and VanWesten-aye. Motion carried 6-0.

Andi Kort, StuCo representative, informed the Board about the Student Council District meeting in Superior.

Principal Scott stated that the math curriculum is being reviewed. Testing of writing and math by the students will begin in the next couple of weeks.

Miller updated the Board on the Buildings and Grounds Committee meeting. Discussion about several proposed projects including the construction of a second gym was held. The board nominated a twelve member committee to assist with the design of the Meridian Public School, District 48-0303

proposed facility. The committee includes members from the public, Board, teaching staff, and administration. The committee will make recommendations to the full Board on the design of the facility.

Superintendent Kort reviewed two options for the 2016-2017 school calendar. The Board will approve the 2016-2017 calendar at the February meeting.

Scheer moved and Miller seconded to keep the three standing committees (Americanism: Scheer, VanWesten, Bartels; Building & Grounds, and Transportation: Miller, Vorderstrasse, Scheer; Curriculum & Instruction: Bartels, VanWesten) the same as the 2015 calendar year. Vote taken: Vorderstrasse-aye, Miller-aye, Sobotka -aye, Bartels-aye, Scheer-aye, and VanWesten-aye. Motion carried 6-0.

Superintendent Kort shared with the Board the request for Friend Public Schools to join the CRC. All CRC member school boards will vote on the request by Friend to join the conference. Miller moved and Bartels seconded to approve the addition of Friend Public Schools to the CRC conference. Vote taken: Vorderstrasseaye, Miller-nay, Sobotka-aye, Bartelsaye, Scheer-nay, and VanWesten-aye. Motion carried 4-2.

Onward to victory... May they win again today...

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
NeSA state testing began the week of January 25 with 4th and 8th grade writing tests. Juniors will have their writing test the first week of February.

We anticipate an enrollment of 15 students in Pre-K for the 2016-2017 school year. These 15 children reside within our district and will be 4 years old on or before July 31st, 2016.



Seniors & Parents:

Scholarship time is here! The list of local scholarships is posted on the school website under the "Counselor" tab. Click on the link that says "go here to my website." From there, find the Scholarship tab and they will all be listed. Make sure you 'download' the documents and save them to your computer so they stay formatted correctly. I have included a local checklist on my page to help you keep track of each scholarship and the requirements. This document is only for your benefit and does not need to be handed in. Please notice due dates and requirements for each scholarship. Do not wait until the last minute to start these! If you need letters of recommendation, make sure you give your recommenders plenty of time to write a letter (a minimum two week notification is ideal)!

It's also FAFSA time! If you're a college-bound senior, you must complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) to apply for state, federal and college-based financial aid. Submit the form before your college's FAFSA priority date (typically between March 1 and April 1) as some financial aid is awarded first -come, first-served. Check with your college(s) to learn their priority date. Complete your taxes early as the FAFSA requires current tax information. Within three weeks after you and your parents file your tax forms, your IRS data should be available to retrieve and transfer into your FAFSA through the IRS Data Retrieval process (available as of February 7, 2016). Go to FAFSA.gov to apply. If you're filling the FAFSA for the first time and/or want *free* help, call EducationQuest to set up an appointment Lincoln in (800.303.3745). Also, an EducationQuest representative will be available in our area for anyone wishing to have individual free help (EducationQuest is still finalizing this date, but has expressed it will be toward the beginning of March--- Mrs. Kroon will communicate that date with senior students as soon as that information is available).


NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY
