Frank moved and Miller seconded to excuse members VanWesten and Jackson. Vote taken: Miller-aye, Frankave, Scheer-ave, and Wolfe-ave. Motion carried 4-0.

Scheer moved and Frank seconded to approve the meeting's agenda. taken: Miller-aye, Frank-aye, Scheer-aye, and Wolfe - aye. Motion carried 4-0.

Seniors:

Many seniors are beginning to finalize their college plans. The deadlines for certain scholarship applications are coming due. Local scholarship applications will be available at the end of the month. Please note that one of the biggest state scholarships is the Susan Buffett Scholarship (due February 1st). A link to this scholarship and all others are found on the "Counselor" link of the school website. Please check the website often for scholarship updates! preparations should be made to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid or FAFSA. The FAFSA will generate your SAR (Student Air Report), which determines federal loan eligibility. Go to https:// fafsa.ed.gov/ to complete this process. Also, each student and parent must apply for a pin at pin.ed.gov. Your PIN can be used each year to electronically apply for federal student aid and to access your Federal Student Aid records online.

If you have questions on this process, please check out the EducationQuest website at www.educationquest.org.

Juniors:

Juniors interested in taking the ACT should sign up to take the February 7th test. Please note the deadline is January 9th. Go to **www.actsutdent.org** to register. If you qualify for Free & Reduced meals, you may be able to use a Fee Waiver (please see Mrs. Frank for details.). Juniors will also be completing the John Baylor ACT Test Prep this spring, which will help them with the ACT or COMPASS test. The COMPASS test is similar to the ACT but used more as a college placement test for many two-year schools.

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Junior students will also begin the job shadow process and begin to explore different college options. Many juniors will be taking online dual-credit college classes this semester as well. Parents... please note that Girls and Boys State applications will be out next month. If your child is interested in attending this weeklong event next summer, make sure they get their application in. If parents have questions on any of these new adventures, please contact my office.

MERIDIAN ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

Enrichment Coordinator: Mrs. Marilyn Bachle

Purpose:

The Meridian Enrichment Program is designed to identify gifted students in grades K-12, provide educational experiences that meet their needs, and help these students develop their capabilities. Students are identified in the following areas: academic/intellectual, specific academic (such as math, or science), leadership, creativity, and visual and performing arts.

Program Goals:

- 1. The Meridian Enrichment Program will identify high-ability learners, K-12.
- 2. The Enrichment Program will identify and address the needs of qualified high-ability learners.
- 3. The Enrichment Program will provide special facilities and/or educational services to assist high-ability learners to progress towards their potential, both within and outside the classroom.
- 4. The Enrichment Program will provide high-ability learners opportunities to develop as a well-rounded citizen.

Identification Process:

The identification process uses multiple criteria to determine which students meet the qualifications for placement in the Enrichment Program. This criteria includes but is not limited to: achievement tests; teacher referrals; student nominations; parent nominations; Renzulli-Hartman Scale for Rating Behavioral Characteristics of Superior Students in the areas of learning, motivational, creativity, leadership, artistic, musical, and dramatics; the Torrance Test for Creativity; and various inventories to measure characteristics of gifted students. Data is collected on all K-12 students and reviewed by the Identification Committee. The data is transferred to an Identification Matrix to see if students qualify for placement in the program. Some students automatically qualify for the program because their achievement test scores are 98% or higher. Every student in the District is monitored and reviewed twice during the school year for placement in the Enrichment Program.

Appeal Process:

At any time during the school year, any district parent/guardian may appeal the identification process and/or request that the district re-evaluate his/her child for placement in the high-ability learner or Enrichment Program. At such time, all available data will be collected for review. The purpose of reviewing the compiled data will be to see if said student has met the qualifications for placement in the program. Parents/guardians have the right to view this data and meet with the Enrichment Coordinator to discuss possible qualification. If the parents/ guardians remain dissatisfied with the decision of the Coordinator, they may appeal the decision to the school Principal. Should the Principal sustain the Coordinator's determination, an appeal may be filed with the Superintendent. The final step of the appeal process will be to file with the Board of Education.









MUDECAS BOYS BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT

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




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
