
As we enter October, please be sure to add a few minutes of travel time and be aware as the farmers are engaged in harvest at this time.

The Meridian Board of Education met on September 15, 2014. The Board approved the 2014-2015 annual budget as presented. The Budget Hearing was held at 7:00 P.M. and the 2014-2015 Tax Request Hearing at 7:15 P.M.

The 2014-2015 General Fund expenditures are set to be \$3,249,724.52 an increase of \$78,521.67 from 2013-2014. The 2014-2015 total requirements for the General Fund, including the cash reserve, are set at \$4,296,100.

The District Assessed Valuation increased 25.25% to a total of \$396,683,832. Based upon this valuation the Board of Education approved tax requests and levy requests of: \$2,187,706 (\$.551499 per \$100 assessed valuation) for the General Fund; \$552,525.25 (\$.139286 per \$100 assessed valuation) for the Special Building Fund; \$206,060.60 (\$.051946 per \$100 assessed valuation) Qualified Capital Purpose Undertaking Fund; \$170,587.56 (\$.043004 per \$100 assessed valuation) for the Technology Bond Fund. Each of the amounts includes the County Treasurer's one percent commission. The total tax request for the 2014-2015 budget is \$3,116,879.84 (\$.785735 per \$100 assessed valuation). The levy request amount decreased \$.093754.

Testing Notes:

- The ACT test prep course taught by Mrs. Toalson & Mrs. Hofstetter is currently in progress. The district will also be offering the John Baylor Test Prep class (free of charge) to seniors starting the first week in October. Both of these classes should help students take the ACT on October 25th. The John Baylor Test Prep class will be offered to the Juniors in January to help them prepare for the February test.
- Juniors interested in taking the PSAT will do so on Wednesday, October 15th. Notes will be sent home with students.
- Seniors needing to take the COMPASS test will do so on Thursday, October 16th. Representatives from SCC-Beatrice will come to Meridian to administer the test to our students. This test is used to help place students in levelappropriate classes for many junior colleges. There is no fee to take this test.

Junior-Senior Parents....If I saw you at Parent-Teacher Conferences, hopefully you picked up a "Guidance Newsletter." Newsletters have also been emailed out. If you didn't receive one and have an email address, please let me know what it is or give me a call to ask that one be mailed to you. This newsletter contains important dates, scholarship lists, college events, in addition to other important tips for college.

Freshmen & Sophomores

Although college or other post-secondary plans seem miles away, this is a key time to remember the importance of grades and involvement in extra-curricular activities. All of these things will help build your resume, which is needed at the beginning of your senior year. We have begun meetings to start working on resumes and to look at career interests. Meeting dates for each class will be posted in the daily announcements.

Junior High

Junior High guidance lessons are taking place every other week during a study hall period. The 7th graders have been focusing on the skills necessary to make the transition to middle school successful. We have already discussed the organized binder and using a planner. The 8th graders have been taking different assessments to find out how they learn best and how they study. The students have had to reflect on these assessments and determine what they need to do to improve their study skill habits.

Elementary

Grades K-6 have been working with a program called Second Step. It is a standards-based program that focuses on increasing success in school and decreasing problem behaviors. Socialselfemotional competence and regulation skills are developed through practice and concepts are taught sequentially across all grade levels. Most elementary classes have already gone through the important skills for learning...focusing attention, listening, using self-talk, and being assertive. If vou have a K-6 student, ask them about these skills!
