I wanted to personally say thank you to everyone who has made the start of the school year so successful. This has been a great start and I expect this to continue throughout the school year. Once again we have many new faces as staff, students and administration so please continue to do your best in helping everyone feel welcome. The start of the year has presented our staff with the opportunity to educate 216 students, this is an increase of 42 students (almost 25%) from the end of school last year. With this increase, we are continuing to make adjustments with transportation, locker space, desks, chairs, and books. President Wolfe called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The open meeting law information was presented. Members present were Miller, Frank, VanWesten, and Wolfe. Also present were Superintendent Kort, Principal Scott, Erin VanderSchaaf, ReNee Henry, and Nancy Paul.

VanWesten moved and Miller seconded to excuse board member Jackson. Vote taken: Miller-aye, Frank-aye, VanWesten -aye, and Wolfe-aye. Motion carried 4-0.

Frank moved and Miller seconded to approve consent agenda as follows:



MERIDIAN ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

The Meridian Enrichment Program is designed to meet the diversified cognitive, emotional, and social needs of high-ability learners, by providing differentiated educational services,

within and beyond the regular classroom. The Enrichment Coordinator will evaluate all students (K through 12) to see if they qualify as high-ability learners. The areas for qualification include intellectual, academic, specific academic, creativity, leadership, and visual and performing arts. The initial identification process will be completed within the first thirty days of school. However, the

identification process is on-going; thus, additional students may qualify any time during the school year. Parents who feel their child might meet the qualifications for placement in the Enrichment Program, should feel free to contact Mrs. Bachle at school. Also, if anyone has questions concerning the Enrichment Program, they should address them to Mrs. Bachle.

National Honor Society


M-PIE



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
