
Since harvest has begun we ask that everyone take a little extra time in their travels to and from school and other activities. 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It is also the time of year when our fall activities are half way through their seasons. The volleyball team won the Meridian Quad, placed 5th at the Friend tournament, and had a strong showing at Mudecas A Division. The football team is learning more and more about 6-man football. They earned a win against St. Edward last Friday. Please come out and support our fall sport teams.

The Meridian Board of Education met on September 16, 2020, the Board approved the 2020-2021 annual budget as presented. The Budget Hearing was held at 6:30 P.M. and the 2020-2021 Tax Request Hearing at 6:45 P.M.

The District Assessed Valuation decreased 3% to a total of \$419,867,746. Based upon this evaluation the Board of Education approved tax requests and levy requests of: \$2,853,535 (\$0.679627 per \$100 assessed valuation) for the General Fund; \$20,202 (\$0.004812 per \$100 assessed valuation) for Special Building Fund; \$0 (\$.0 per \$100 assessed valuation) Qualified Capital Purpose Undertaking Fund; \$0 (\$.0 per \$100 assessed valuation) for the Technology Bond Fund. Each of the amounts includes the County Treasurer's one percent commission. The total tax request for the 2020-2021 budget is \$2,873,737 (\$.684439 per \$100 assessed valuation). A majority of this increase came from the loss of \$108,000 in state aid, option money.

- 5. Stay seated until the bus stops or as directed by the driver.
- 6. Be quiet to avoid accidents there must be absolute QUIET at a railroad crossing stop.
- 7. Keep your head and arms inside the bus at all times.
- 8. Cross street/roads only when it is safe.
- 9. Obey the bus driver.

- •Keep an updated list of activities, honors, and volunteer or paid jobs
- •Earn the best possible ACT/SAT scores by taking the exams in the spring of your junior year and again in the fall of your senior year. Use the On To College Prep to help study.
- •Use quality references such as a teacher, coach or counselor. Give them advance notice (at least 2 weeks), a specific deadline, and a copy of your Activities Resume.
- Ask at least two people to proofread your college or scholarship application.

- Create an FSA ID for you and one for a parent. You'll need them for FAFSA. You can also do this at the EducationQuest Financial Meeting on October 9.
- Complete the FAFSA on or after October 1.

COVID LUNCH PROGRAM

Meridian Public Schools qualifies for a Federal Lunch program through the Nebraska Department of Education. This program authorizes participating schools to serve breakfast and lunch at no cost to ANY student. Adult meals and our afternoon milks DO NOT QUALIFY. This program is valid from August 19, 2020, until December 31, 2020.

If you have paid for lunches or have a positive balance which carried over, it will remain in your student's account until our second semester. For those students who have been charged for their meals, Meridian has issued a credit for ALL MEALS taken from their accounts. Pre-K through 2nd Grade students will still be accountable for the afternoon milk.
