Meridian Public School Board of Education met on December 21, 2020, as per notice in the Fairbury Journal-News.

President Bartels called the meeting to order at 6:01 p.m. The open meeting law information was presented.

Roll call was taken: Scheer-present, Sobotka-present, VanWesten-present, Niederklein-present-virtually, and Bartels-present. Also present were Superintendent Kort, Principal Scott, Brian Rut, Lane Barton, and Brayden Rut.

Nothing new was added to the agenda.

VanWesten moved and Scheer seconded to excuse Vorderstrasse from the meeting. Vote taken: Sobotka-aye, VanWesten-aye, Scheer-aye, Niederklein -aye, Bartels-aye. Motion passed 5-0.

No comments were heard from the public.

VanWesten moved and Sobotka seconded to approve the consent agenda as presented.

Vote taken: Sobotka-aye, VanWestenaye, Scheer-aye, Niederklein-aye, Bartels -aye. Motion passed 5-0.

Teachers' in-service in January will focus on Math and setting five year goals. Ms. Ruiz certificate has been approved and hopefully the immigration process will now proceed.

The yearly review of the District's English Language program has been completed. The District, with the help of ESU, started a mental health program last year. The program has been successful with an individual coming once a week to talk with students and staff.

Sobotka moved and VanWesten seconded to approve Policy 7000 series. Vote taken: Sobotka-aye, VanWestenaye, Scheer-aye, Niederklein-aye, Bartels -aye. Motion passed 5-0.

Michael Heidemann requested that the District enter an access easement to farm ground across the District's south property line. The Heidemann family is selling the farmstead and they don't want to maintain an access easement across

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their property to the existing farm ground. The matter was tabled and it was stated that Superintendent Kort and Board member Sobotka will further investigate. The Board will continue this discussion at the January Board Meeting.

- * JH basketball teams (and younger) are having success starting off the season with tournament wins. JH boys won the Lewiston tournament. JH girls won the Dorchester tournament. 5th-6th grade boys won the Fairbury tournament.
- * JV girls and boys basketball teams both won the Meridian JV Tournament. Congratulations to all!
- * Wrestlers are having individual successes on the mat.
- * High school basketball and wrestling continues over break. Keep watching for updates to visitor guidelines and media broadcasts.
- * Elementary and JH/HS concerts were presented virtually online – prerecorded.
- * School will dismiss for break on Tuesday, December 22 at 1:30 p.m. Teachers will be back on Monday, January 4, for in-service work on curriculum and school improvement. Students return on Tuesday, January 5.

Sobotka moved and VanWesten seconded to approve the teachers negotiations for the 2021-2022 school year. The total negotiated package is an approximately 3 percent increase from 2020-2021. Vote taken: Sobotka -aye, VanWesten-aye, Scheer-aye, Niederklein-aye, Bartels-aye. Motion passed 5-0.

Evaluation forms for Superintendent Kort were reviewed. The Board felt that Superintendent Kort meets or exceeds expectations in all four performance objectives that include budget, communication, positive school culture, and instructional leadership.

Jay VanWesten was thanked for his 15 years of dedicated service as a Board member representing both Jefferson and Saline Counties.

Next Regular Meeting was set for Monday, January 18, 2021, at 6:00 p.m.

VanWesten moved and Scheer seconded to adjourn at 6:55 p.m. Vote taken: Sobotka-aye, VanWesten-aye, Scheer-aye, Niederklein-aye, Bartelsaye. Motion passed 5-0.

Upcoming Dates:

January 8 – Deadline to register for February 6 ACT Test

Seniors:

- * Many seniors are beginning to finalize their college plans. Seniors should be done at this point with applying to their top college choices. If they have not done so, they need to complete their college applications as soon as possible! The deadlines for certain scholarship applications are coming due.
- * Local scholarship applications will be available at the end of the month. Please note that one of the biggest state scholarships is the Susan Buffett Scholarship (due February 1st). A link to this scholarship and all others are found on the "Counselor" link of the school website.
- * Scholarships, scholarships, scholarships. Make an account at ScholarshipQuest to find Nebraska-based awards, and also check out the counselor website for the ones that Ms. Hermsmeier has received.
- * Please check my counselor website often for scholarship updates! Seniors, see additional information regarding the FAFSA below!

Juniors:

¹ Juniors interested in taking the ACT should sign up to take the February 6th, April 17th, or June 12th test. When making ACT plans, juniors should know that they will also be taking the ACT free of charge at school in April as a part of state testing. For all ACT tests other than the school test, go to www.actstudent.org to register. If you qualify for Free & Reduced meals, you may be able to use a Fee Waiver (please see Ms. Hermsmeier for details).

- * Juniors will also have the option to take the ACCUPLACER test at the beginning of this semester (previously known as the COMPASS test). The ACCUPLACER test is similar to the ACT but is used more as a college placement test for many two-year schools. Please sign up with Ms. Hermsmeier if you are interested.
- * Parents... please note that Girls and Boys State applications will be out next month. If your child is interested in attending this weeklong event next summer, make sure they submit their applications.

Campus Visits:

- * Seniors and parents: You are encouraged to make any remaining campus visits in January if possible to schools you are seriously considering attending in the fall of 2021.
- * Juniors and parents: Don't forget that you are allowed two excused absences during your junior year to go on a campus visit! Arrangements should be made through Ms. Hermsmeier for campus visits and student sign out sheets.
- * Forms with sample questions are available in the counselors office.

<u>Information on Collegebound</u> <u>Nebraska (for the University of</u> <u>Nebraska):</u>

You will pay no tuition as an undergraduate student at the University of Nebraska if you: ·Are a Nebraska Resident; Meet the university's admission requirements; and ·Qualify for the Federal Pell Grant Program. If you file the FAFSA and are told you are not eligible for a Federal Pell Grant, the university will automatically review your FAFSA to determine whether you qualify for Collegebound Nebraska. If your expected family contribution is \$5,000 or less, you will qualify. (Note: family students with expected contributions above \$5,300 may qualify for grant assistance but for amounts less than full tuition.)

Seniors, Complete Your FAFSA:

Seniors... if you haven't done so already, it's time to complete the FAFSA! The FAFSA (Free Application

for Federal Student Aid) is the application for state, federal and collegespecific financial aid. Contact Ms. Hermsmeier for more information if you haven't already filed the FAFSA. Priority filing dates will soon be approaching! For those of you how have already completed the FAFSA, expect financial aid award notifications soon from the colleges you listed on your FAFSA. The notifications will detail the financial aid assistance the colleges are offering (could be a combination of scholarships, grants, work-study, and student loans).

Seed and Plant Sales

The Meridian 7-12 grade students will be selling seed packets and plants after the new year. Sales will run a little differently this year. The seed sales will run from January 7th through January 25th, with delivery during Parent Teacher Conferences - the week of February 15th -18th. This allows you to get an early start on planting, if you so choose. With the early arrival of the packets, you will have time to start the seeds indoors and have seedlings ready for outside planting. Due to COVID, we are trying to limit the contact our students have with the public to a minimum. 
