Since harvest has begun we ask that everyone take a little extra time in their travels to and from school and other activities. When behind a combine, tractor or truck please be careful especially before passing. This time of year, the sun begins to play a large factor in your visibility. BE SAFE!

Norris Public Power District came to Meridian and gave a presentation to both elementary and high school students. This was a great opportunity to remind students of the danger of electricity and safety measures that need to be taken if around downed lines.

Our fall activities are half way through their respective seasons. The volleyball team won the Giltner Quad, and had a strong showing at Mudecas A division. Currently, the girls are 6-3 and off to a great start. The football team is learning more and more about 6-man football. They earned a win to start the year against Dorchester and are currently 1-2. Please come out and support our fall sport teams.

The Meridian Board of Education met on September 12, 2021, and the Board approved the 2021-2022 annual budget as presented. The Budget Hearing was held at 6:00 P.M. and the 2021-2022 Tax Request Hearing immediately afterwards.

The District Assessed Valuation increased 1% to a total of \$423,943,288. Based upon this evaluation the Board of Education approved tax requests and levy requests of: \$2,883,838 (\$0.680241 per \$100 assessed valuation) for the General Fund; \$45,455 (\$0.010722 per \$100 assessed valuation) for Special Building Fund; \$0 (\$ .0 per \$100 assessed valuation) Qualified Capital Purpose Undertaking Fund; \$0 (\$ .0 per \$100 assessed valuation) for the

Technology Bond Fund. Each of the amounts includes the County Treasurer's one percent commission. The total tax request for the 2021-2022 budget is \$2,929,293 (\$ .690963 per \$100 assessed valuation).

• The On To College Prep (formerly John Baylor ACT Prep) is an investment provided by our school to assist your student in preparing for the ACT. All students have access to this test prep. All seniors are more than welcome to take it this semester, and all juniors will take in next semester before the required state ACT test. For more information, talk to Ms. Hermsmeier.

#### **Seniors:**

It is time to start the admission process! College may still seem far off, but admission deadlines will hit as early as December. Follow these steps to stay on track:

Contact your top colleges NOW and ask:

- About application deadlines for college-based admission, scholarships, and financial aid.
- If you need a separate application for scholarships.
- If you should apply online or submit a hardcopy application.
- About application fees.

Much of this information can be found by visiting their website and visiting the college rep when they come to Meridian.

Follow these tips to increase your chances of earning scholarships:

- Don't pay for scholarship services! Free resources include ScholarshipQuest at EducationQuest.org, your school counselor's office, and EducationQuest offices in Omaha, Lincoln, and Kearney.
- Focus on college-based and local scholarships. You're more likely to earn them over large national awards.
- Keep an updated list of activities, honors, and volunteer or paid jobs
- Earn the best possible ACT/SAT scores by taking the exams in the spring of your junior year and again in the fall of your senior year. Use the On To College Prep to help study.
- Use quality references such as a teacher, coach or counselor. Give them advance notice (at least 2 weeks), a specific deadline, and a copy of your Activities Resume.
- Ask at least two people to proofread college or scholarship application.

#### Senior "To Do" List:

- Create an FSA ID for you and one for a parent. You'll need them for FAFSA. You can also do this at the EducationQuest Financial Meeting in October.
- Complete the FAFSA on or after October 1.
- Complete college applications.






