Normal – I hesitated to mention this, but it seems that the school year has begun to seem normal. Students are in class, with students competing in FFA events, One Act, Football and Volleyball have just finished their seasons, now we are preparing for winter sports. We are estimating 6 boys for wrestling, 13 boys for basketball, and 22 for girls' basketball. We are very close to having 65% of our students being involved in our activities. That is great news!

Regular November 15, 2021 Meeting Meridian Public School Board of

Education met on November 15, 2021, as per notice in the Fairbury Journal-News.

President Bartels called the hearing to order at 7:01 p.m. The open meeting law information was presented.

Roll call was taken: Vorderstrasse – present, Niederklein – present, Sobotka– present, Rut – present, and Bartels – present. Also present was Superintendent Kort and Principal Scott.

Nothing new was added to the agenda.

Niederklein moved and Vorderstrasse seconded to excuse Scheer from the meeting. Vote taken: Vorderstrasse – aye, Niederklein – aye, Sobotka – aye, Rut – aye, and Bartels – aye. Motion passed 5-0.

No comments were heard from the public.

Rut moved and Sobotka seconded to approve the consent agenda as presented.

Vote taken: Vorderstrasse – aye, Niederklein – aye, Sobotka – aye, Rut – aye, and Bartels – aye. Motion passed 5-0.

Curriculum report:

- The teachers continue to work on reading techniques. One example is using critical thinking to help the students understand what they are reading.
- The seniors visited the WWI Museum in Kansas City on November 9, 2021, since they were unable to go last year due to Covid-19. The juniors will visit the museum in the spring of 2022.

The Hazard Mitigation Resolution was presented to the Board. Sobotka reminded the Board that participating entities are eligible for pre- and post-disaster mitigation funds for a wide variety of projects.

Sobotka moved and Rut seconded to approve the Hazard Mitigation Resolution. Vote taken: Vorderstrasse – aye, Niederklein – aye, Sobotka – aye, Rut – aye, and Bartels – aye. Motion passed 5-0.

Niederklein moved and Vorderstrasse seconded to approve the teachers negotiations for the 2022-2023 school year. The total negotiated package is approximately a 3% increase from 2021-2022. Vote taken: Vorderstrasse – aye, Niederklein – aye, Sobotka – aye, Rut – aye, and Bartels – aye. Motion passed 5-0.

Superintendent Kort presented information on the remainder of the first semester calendar.



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Vorderstrasse moved and Rut seconded to grant the administration the authority to shorten the 1st semester by one school day. Vote taken: Vorderstrasse – aye, Niederklein – aye, Sobotka – aye, Rut – aye, and Bartels – aye. Motion passed 5-0.

Superintendent Kort summarized the 2020-2021 Audit completed by Dana Cole.

Niederklein moved and Sobotka seconded to approve the Annual Audit Report. Vote taken: Vorderstrasse – aye, Niederklein – aye, Sobotka – aye, Rut – aye, and Bartels – aye. Motion passed 5-0.

The Multicultural Report was reviewed.

Sobotka moved and Rut seconded to approve the Multicultural Report. Vote taken: Vorderstrasse – aye, Niederklein – aye, Sobotka – aye, Rut – aye, and Bartels – aye. Motion passed 5-0.

Policy 6000s were reviewed. The policies will be presented for approval at the December meeting.

Policy 4047 – "Professional Boundaries and Appropriate Relationships between Employees and Students" was presented for approval.

Superintendent Kort gave an update on the new scorer's table that is being designed and ordered. Hopefully it will be available for use after the first of the year.

2nd Semester Schedule Changes

All 7-12 students interested in making changes to their 2nd semester schedule should do so before the holiday break. Please plan to do this the week December 13-17. Freshman to Seniors... College Timeline will keep you on track to college EducationQuest has a College Timeline (https://www.educationquest.org/

myeducationquest/college-timeline/) students in grades 9-12 that spells out steps you should take during fall, winter, spring, and summer of each year to plan for college.

The Timeline also allows you to add your own tasks, get reminders when it's time to complete tasks, and check off tasks when they're complete. You can access these features by creating and/or logging into your MyEducationQuest account at EducationOuest.org. Check it out and give it a try. It will make the college planning process more manageable!

ACT Registration

This is a reminder that to register for the ACT, an account needs to be created at www.actstudent.org. From here, you will fill in specific information and also select your testing date and site. Each ACT costs \$60.00, but if you qualify for free or reduced lunches, you may request a fee waiver from Mrs. Hermsmeier. Our school code is 282-345. Please feel free to contact Mrs. Hermsmeier with any questions or concerns. Juniors, earn the best possible ACT/SAT scores by taking the exam in the spring of your junior year and again in the fall of your senior year. You must register by January 7, for the February 12 ACT, by February 25, for the April 2 ACT, and/ or by May 6, for the June 11 ACT. Keep in mind that all juniors will be taking the ACT at school in April.

Seniors...have you submitted your college applications?

If you haven't submitted your college admission applications yet, it's time to get serious! Contact your top college choices for application deadlines and procedures. Ask if the admission application is also the application for college-based scholarships. If not, ask about the scholarship application process. By now, you should have applied to your top three colleges, and you should also be working on upcoming scholarships. The counseling webpage and the senior google classroom is updated with scholarships periodically! Please make sure you know deadlines for scholarships offered by the college(s) of your choice.

Senior FAFSA Information (Free **Application for Federal Student Aid)**

Seniors, if you haven't done so already, it's time to file the FAFSA! You'll need to complete the form before your college's priority date (typically March 1 or April 1) to apply for federal, state, and college-based financial aid. You and a parent can complete the form at FAFSA.gov. Before you start, create an FSA ID for you and one for a parent at fsaid.ed.gov. You'll need them to access and sign the FAFSA.

What to expect after you submit your

The FAFSA opened October 1 so many of you have already completed and submitted your form. Here's what happens next:

- * Expect a Student Aid Report (SAR). You'll receive it via an email link if you provided an email address on your FAFSA. The SAR acknowledges that vour FAFSA was received, and if vou need to take further action to process vour FAFSA.
- Make sure you applied for admission to colleges you listed on your FAFSA. Colleges who receive your FAFSA results typically won't send you a financial aid package until you've applied and have been accepted to the school.
- Watch for verification requests. The college(s) you listed on your FAFSA might request verification of your FAFSA information. If so, send the required documents to the colleges' financial aid office. The college will not process your financial aid until they receive the documents.
- Watch for financial aid award **notifications**. The colleges you applied to – and listed on your FAFSA – will send you a financial aid award notification detailing the types and amounts of aid they're offering based on your financial need.

Winning the Scholarship Game

Follow these tips to increase your chances of earning scholarships:

- Don't ever pay for scholarship searches! Use free resources such as ScholarshipQuest EducationQuest.org with over 2,000 Nebraska-based scholarships. Free national sites include Peterson's, FindTuition, Cappex, and Chegg.
- * Visit your school counselor often for information about local scholarships.
- * Focus on local and college-specific scholarships because you're more likely to earn them.
- * Earn the best possible ACT/SAT scores by taking the exam in the spring of your junior year and again in the fall of your senior year.
- * Use quality references such as a teacher, coach or counselor. Encourage them to write specific examples of your leadership skills. Give them at least two weeks advance notice and a specific deadline.

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
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
