Meridian honored the **NSAA** Moratorium which began December 22nd and concluded on the 26th. Students will be reporting back for class on January 5th. During this time, the basketball and wrestling teams will still be competing. The wrestlers will have a meet in Geneva on December 29th, the start time will be 9:00 AM. The basketball teams will be entering into the first year of the DGMT (Dragons, Griffins, Mustangs, Trojans) Holiday tournament. Meridian will play at Tri County on Monday the 27th with Girls JV starting at 4:00 PM. Meridian Public School Board of Education met on December 20, 2021, as per notice in the Fairbury Journal-News.

President Bartels called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The open meeting law information was presented.

Roll call was taken: Vorderstrasse present, Niederklein - present, Rut present, Scheer – present, and Bartels –

present present. Also Superintendent Kort and Principal Scott.

Nothing new was added to the agenda.

Scheer moved and Vorderstrasse seconded to excuse Sobotka from the meeting. Vote taken: Vorderstrasse – aye, Niederklein – aye, Rut – aye, Scheer – aye, and Bartels – aye. Motion passed 5-0.

No comments were heard from the public.

Rut moved and Scheer seconded to approve the consent agenda as presented.

Curriculum report:

• The Language Arts and Math scores from NSCAS for the 2020/2021 school year were reviewed.

Mr. Kort gave an update on the ESSERS The fund will be spent on cleaning supplies/equipment, technology and shop equipment. There has also been discussion on the ESU having a new teacher trainer.

The 6000s policy was sent out and reviewed last month. Rut moved and Vorderstrasse seconded to approve the 6000s policy. Vote taken: Vorderstrasse aye, Niederklein – aye, Rut – aye, Scheer – aye, and Bartels – aye. Motion passed 5-0.

Principal's Report:

- Current student count Elementary 110 and High School – 95, including 2 exchange students.
- Congratulations to the JH boys basketball team who won the Lewiston
- · Meridian one act "Mmmbeth" placed 4th at CRC South (one judge placed us

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3rd), 4th out of 8 at Pawnee City Invite vs class A,B,C & D schools, and 3rd at districts (one judge placed us 2nd). The team had a great season.

- Meridian students in grades 3-8 overall scored above the state average in English/Language Arts in percent proficiency on the NSCAS state test last spring. Math scores overall were slightly below the state average.
- NSAA Moratorium is December 22-26. No practice or competitions.
- Teachers return on Tuesday, January 4, 2022 for a full day of in-service meetings.
- Students return on Wednesday, January 5, 2022.
- Speech season begins with the first meet on Saturday, January 15th at Fairbury. There are currently 12 students signed up to participate, with several other students still considering.
- •Mr. Scott & Miss Drees continue to work with Yandas on the new light & sound system. This will potentially be installed the first part of April.

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COUNSELOR'S CONNECTION by Lisa Hermsmeier

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Seniors:

- * Many seniors are beginning to finalize their college plans. Seniors should be done at this point with applying to their top college choices. If they have not done so, they need to complete their college applications as soon as possible! The deadlines for certain scholarship applications are coming due.
- * Local scholarship applications will be available at the end of the month. Please note that one of the biggest state scholarships is the Susan Buffett Scholarship (due February 1st). A link to this scholarship and all others are found on the "Counselor" link of the school website.
- * Scholarships, scholarships, scholarships. Make an account at ScholarshipQuest to find Nebraska-based awards, and also check out the counselor website for the ones that Ms. Hermsmeier has received.
- * Please check my counselor website often for scholarship updates! Seniors, see additional information regarding the FAFSA below!



Juniors

- should sign up to take the February 12th, April 2nd, or June 11th test. When making ACT plans, juniors should know that they will also be taking the ACT free of charge at school in March as a part of state testing. For all ACT tests other than the school test, go to www.actsutdent.org to register. If you qualify for Free & Reduced meals, you may be able to use a Fee Waiver (please see Ms. Hermsmeier for details).
- * Juniors will also have the option to take the ACCUPLACER (previously known as the COMPASS) test at the beginning of this semester. The ACCUPLACER test is similar to the ACT, but is used more as a college placement test for many two-year schools. Please sign up with Ms. Hermsmeier if you are interested.
- * Parents... please note that Girls and Boys State applications will be out next month. If your child is interested



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in attending this weeklong event next summer, make sure they submit their applications.

Campus Visits:

- * Seniors and parents: You are encouraged to make any remaining campus visits in January if possible to schools you are seriously considering attending in the fall of 2022.
- * Juniors and parents: Don't forget that you are allowed two excused absences during your junior year to go on a campus visit! Arrangements should be made through Ms. Hermsmeier for campus visits and student sign out sheets.
- * Forms with sample questions are available in the counselors office.

<u>Information</u> on <u>Collegebound</u> <u>Nebraska</u> (for the <u>University</u> of <u>Nebraska</u>):

You will pay no tuition as an undergraduate student at the University of Nebraska if you: Are a Nebraska Resident; Meet the university's admission requirements; and Qualify for the Federal Pell Grant Program. If you file the FAFSA and are told you are not eligible for a Federal Pell Grant, the university will automatically review your FAFSA to determine whether you

qualify for Collegebound Nebraska. If your expected family contribution is \$5,000 or less, you will qualify. (Note: students with expected family contributions above \$5,300 may qualify for grant assistance but for amounts less than full tuition.)

Seniors, complete your FAFSA:

Seniors... if you haven't done so already, it's time to complete the FAFSA! The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is the application for state, federal, and college-specific financial aid. Contact Ms. Hermsmeier for more information if you haven't already filed the FAFSA. Priority filing dates will soon be approaching! For those of you who have already completed the FAFSA, expect financial aid award notifications soon from the colleges you listed on your FAFSA. The notifications will detail the financial aid assistance the colleges are offering (could be a combination of scholarships, grants, work-study, and student loans).
