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It is hard to believe but the 2021-2022 school year has concluded and Meridian is proud to have graduated 18 students (including 3 exchange students) this past month. We wish nothing but the best for our graduates as they begin the next steps of their lives. I would like to add an additional personal touch on this. Having both of my daughters graduate from Meridian has been a true honor. I feel both Andi and Ally have had so many opportunities and have been prepared for the next steps in life with the experience they encountered here at Meridian. We have a great staff here at Meridian and will continue to work on improving ourselves to give all students the best opportunities for success.

The beginning of summer is always a fun and great time of the year. I enjoy driving along the countryside and watching the crops starting to grow - knowing in a matter of weeks the corn will be knee high - and seeing the landscape change. It is always great to see the green fields and pastures especially with the rain we have recently received. I just hope we are able to enjoy some more rain later in June and July.

### 2022 NEBRASKA CHILDREN'S **GROUNDWATER FESTIVAL**

On Tuesday May 17, 2022, the juniors and sophomores from the Meridian Enrichment group were presenters for the 33<sup>rd</sup> Nebraska Children's Groundwater Festival at the Central Community College and College Park at Grand Island, Nebraska. The Groundwater Festival promotes conservation of groundwater quality and use providing an event for water and natural resources professionals to teach up to 1000 students in one day.

Over 31,000 students have been educated at the festival since 1988. Each school attends six in-depth classroom activities and a stage show. Among the classroom activities was the presentation of the Meridian Enrichment group. Group members included juniors: Chase Bartels. Kailyn Paul, Amber Vinsonhaler and sophomores: Kolton Kumpf, Kymber Schwisow, Jaala Stewart and Evelvn Woitalewicz. The Meridian Enrichment group's presentation was titled Eco-Friendly Alternative Household Cleaners. Students use activities using safe alternative cleaning solutions such as vinegar and baking soda, which will harm the groundwater environment. The Meridian students presented seven, twenty-five minute sessions to fourth and fifth grade students from twenty different schools. Some of the schools that came, traveled over three hours to attend the festival. The Meridian Enrichment group did a very good job presenting. They represented Meridian Public School with class. They were complimented on their presentation by all of the teachers. This says a lot about their character and maturity. Congrats on a job well done!

### 2022-2023 PHYSICALS

Jefferson Community Health and Life Fairbury Clinic will be offering sports physicals to students of any grade by appointment. On May 26th, June 23rd, and July 28th from 4:40 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., Fairbury Clinic is offering evening appointments. If you would like to take advantage of the evening schedule, please call 402-729-3361 and make your appointment. Kindergarten, 7th Grade, foreign exchange students, and students who move to our district from out of state are also required to have Nebraska physicals and State school immunization requirements must be met. In addition to physical, Kindergarten. foreign



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exchange students, and students who move to our district from out of state will need an eye exam. Please call 402-729-3361 schedule to your appointment. Physicals be completed before August 1, 2022. Students must bring all forms with their name and date of birth on each as indicated - including the medical history form. These forms also require a signature by a parent or guardian. If a student comes to their without completed appointment forms, they will need to reschedule their physical.

The price of each physical without insurance will be \$85 with an additional \$34 charge if a urine sample is required (7th Grade and Kindergarten). If you would like this ran through your insurance as a Well Child Check, make sure you have not submitted a Well Child Check within a year and notify the clinic at the time of scheduling. If urine is required, please pick up a sterile cup from the clinic ahead of time.

Physical forms can be found at the back of this newsletter, at the District Office of Meridian Public Schools, or on the NSAA website (nsaa.home). Please fill out all of the attached forms. You need to include a signed NSAA Parent and Student Consent form when you turn your physicals in to the school. Student athletes are NOT allowed to play without a completed consent form on file at the school.

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
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
