President Bartels called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The open meeting law information was presented.

Roll call was taken: Barton - present, Niederklein – present, Sobotka present, Rut - present, and Bartels present. Also present were Superintendent Kort and Ms. Drees.

Nothing new was added to the agenda.

Niederklein moved and Barton seconded to excuse Scheer from the meeting. Vote taken: Barton - aye, Niederklein – aye, Sobotka – aye, Rut - aye, and Bartels – aye. Motion passed 5-0.

No comments were heard from the public.

Rut moved and Sobotka seconded to approve the consent agenda as presented.

Spring is officially here, which means it's time to start thinking about schedules for next year! I will be meeting with students in grades 6-11 to get an idea of the classes they would like to take. Once a schedule is set for next year, students will have a chance to finalize their selections. As a reminder, all Meridian high school students need 4 years of English and Social Studies, 3 years of Math and Science, 2 years of Fine Arts, 1 year Technology, each of Physical Education, and Vocational or Foreign Language. Also, starting the next school year, students will be required to take and pass their Personal Finance class as a state requirement for graduation. Thankfully, we are ahead of the game, and students are already required to take this class per board policy. Parents, please be sure to discuss your student's plan for the upcoming year.

Once again, next year's Junior and Senior students will have an opportunity to take dual-credit online college classes. Certain requirements to participate in these classes do apply. Right now, we utilize college resources through Peru State College, Southeast Community College, and Doane University. Students also have an participate opportunity to in SENCAP's Career Academy, which is a great way to earn college credits free of charge! Students have been informed of these offerings. Parents, if you have questions regarding these opportunities, please talk to your child or feel free to contact me.

Seniors ... it's decision time! If you haven't done so already, it's time to choose the college that's the right fit for you. Compare your college acceptance letters, financial aid award notifications, and campus visit notes. List the pros and cons of each school using the following criteria:

•Location – Is the college too close? If you come home every weekend, you won't experience true campus life. Is the college too far away? If so, you may not make it home as often as you'd like.

•Cost – Can your family afford the school? What can you expect for financial aid beyond your freshman year? Did you receive renewable scholarships? How much in student and parent loans will you need to cover expenses?

- •Academic program Which college offers the degree program that best fits your career interests? What happens if you change majors? Does the college offer other degree programs that interest you?
- •Student life Does the school offer activities you will enjoy? Do you like the living arrangements provided by the school? Will you have an opportunity to work on or near campus?
- •Make your final decision by May 1 and then notify the colleges you're rejecting so they can offer your spot, and any financial aid, to another student.

REMINDER: Local scholarships are due APRIL 15th! The application forms for all scholarships are found on the school website under the administration -counselor tab. Be sure to follow directions and complete all steps of each application. Also, you need to let me know of any scholarships you receive, as those scholarships will be announced at graduation.

If you haven't completed the FAFSA yet, now is the time to do so! Remember, the FAFSA will provide you with a Student Aid Report, which will determine your financial aid eligibility for next year.

Juniors: Many of you have taken the opportunity this spring to visit a college of interest. I would encourage more of you to do this if you can find time around spring events. If you need help scheduling a visit, let me know! When you visit, remember to take a "Campus Visit Form" with you so the office can mark it as an excused absence.

Juniors... these questions will help you narrow your college choices

By picking your top colleges now, you'll be better prepared to apply for financial aid and college admission early next fall. Start by answering these questions:

What do you want to study? Explore your career interest and then research colleges that offer programs in areas you may want to pursue.

What kind of school do you want to attend?

Do you prefer a large university or a small college? Are you interested in a community college? What kind of student/teacher ratio do you want?

Where do you want to go to college?

Do you want to live close to home or far away? Do you want to be in a major city or a small town? How big of a factor is out-of-state or private school tuition? If you want to go out of state, investigate programs like the Midwest Student Exchange Program which may provide discounted tuition.

What can you afford?

Consider overall costs: tuition, room and board, books, transportation, and personal expenses. Determine what you and your parents can afford to pay out-of -pocket and plan to apply for financial aid to help make up the difference. Calculate the loan debt you and your parents may need to incur to pay for your college education.

Reminder: The registration deadline for the June 10th ACT is May 5th. Go to www.actstudent.org to register. Fee waivers are available for students who qualify for free/reduced lunch – visit with Ms. Hermsmeier if you would like a waiver. Grades 3-8 Will Soon Be Taking State Assessments

Testing dates are April 3 – May 12, 2023. Meridian will have a testing schedule for students, so the students should be aware when they will be testing. Don't forget to make sure your child(ren) get a good night's rest, eat breakfast on the day of the assessment, and stay positive!

The NSCAS (pronounced, "en-skass") Summative assessment adapts dynamically based on each student's ability and includes innovative, interactive question formats that engage students and enable them to demonstrate higher order thinking. At the high school level, the ACT college entrance exam, provided to all juniors, will continue to serve as the summative assessment in English language arts, math, and science. The juniors took this test on March 21.

2023 Driver's Education Class

This Driver's Education Class is certified through the State of Nebraska Department of Motor Vehicles. To qualify for this class you will need to be 14 before October 14, 2022 and registered with Mr. Filipi by May 15, 2023. . The class will consist of 30-36 hours of online instruction, 5 hours of supervised practice driving, and a 10-15 minute driving test. The lecture part of the class will be the AAA How To Drive Online Course. You will need to email me at dean.filipi@emwolves.net to sign up for the class. The fee for the class is \$305. Payment will be needed before you receive your pass code for the online Once you have completed the class. practice driving part of the course we will meet in Exeter to take the driving test. Once you have completed the online class and email me the Certificate of Completion I will enter you into the DMV system. We will do the driving part of the class this summer.
