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WELCOME to the 2022-2023 school year! I want to express how excited we are to start another school year here at Meridian. I had the opportunity to visit with some fellow classmates of mine this past week. It was a nice to visit with them and discuss our old times, the memories, the games, and appreciate the closeness of a family feel in the school you are attending. I had graduated with the big class (at that time) of 33. Driving home allowed me time to reflect on our students and family feel here at Meridian. 2022-2023 HOT LUNCH PRICING

The Keep Kids Fed Act was signed into law on June 25, 2022. This law ended the free meals for all students implemented during the COVID pandemic. This means all students WILL NOT receive free meals in the 2022-2023 school year household who believes they qualify, will need to submit an application to receive either free or reduced meals. If your household does not qualify for free or reduced meals, you will need to pay full price (Breakfast: Elementary -\$1.30, 7-12 grade - \$1.55; Lunch: Elementary - \$2.60, 7-12 grade -\$2.70). Please bring all lunch and milk money to Trish in the main office. If you are paying with a check, please make it payable to "Meridian Hot Lunch" and kept separate from all other payments.

2022-2023 PHYSICALS

Kindergarten, 7th Grade, foreign exchange students, and students who move to our district from out of state are required have Nebraska to physicals. and State school immunization requirements must be met. ALL Student athletes (Grades 7-12) and cheerleaders MUST HAVE a Pre-participation Physical including the Evaluation Medical Eligibility Form completed and signed by a doctor practicing in the United States BEFORE they are allowed practice. A signed NSAA Parent and Student Consent form will need to be submitted along with the physical. Student athletes are NOT allowed to play without a completed consent form on file at the school.


