Regular January 19, 2023 Meeting Meridian Public School Board of Education met on January 19, 2023, as per notice in the Fairbury Journal-News.

President Bartels called the hearing to order at 6:00 p.m. The open meeting law information was presented.

Roll call was taken: Niederklein present, Sobotka – present, Rut – present, and Bartels – present. Also present were Superintendent Kort and Ms. Drees.

Newly elected board member, Barton, took the oath of office.

Superintendent Kort was appointed to preside over the process to elect a president.

Sobotka nominated and Barton seconded to elect Bartels as Board President.

Niederklein moved and Rut seconded to cease nominations. Vote taken: Barton – aye, Niederklein – aye, Sobotka – aye, Rut – aye, and Bartels – abstain. Motion passed 4-0. Bartels was elected President.

Superintendent Kort turned the meeting over to President Bartels.

Rut nominated and Niederklein seconded to elect Sobotka as Board Vice President.

Niederklein moved and Rut seconded to cease nominations. Vote taken: Barton - aye, Niederklein - aye, Sobotka - abstain, Rut - aye, and Bartels - aye. Motion passed 4-0. Sobotka was elected Board Vice President.

Sobotka nominated and Barton seconded to elect Niederklein as Board Secretary.

Sobotka moved and Rut seconded to cease nominations. Vote taken: Barton - aye, Niederklein - abstain, Sobotka aye, Rut - aye, and Bartels - aye. Motion passed 4-0. Niederklein was elected Board Secretary.

Sobotka nominated and Barton seconded to elect Rut Board Treasurer.

Niederklein moved and Sobotka seconded to cease nominations. Vote taken: Barton - aye, Niederklein - aye, Sobotka – aye, Rut – abstain, and Bartels – aye. Motion passed 4-0. Rut was elected Board Treasurer.

Nothing new was added to the agenda.

Rut moved and Sobotka seconded to excuse Scheer from the meeting. Vote taken: Barton - aye, Niederklein - aye, Sobotka - aye, Rut - aye, and Bartels aye. Motion passed 5-0.

Comments were heard from the public.

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Seniors & Parents...make sure you complete the FAFSA process

Getting financial aid for college involves more than completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Complete each step of the process so that you don't miss out on money for college.

- 1. If you haven't already, complete your 2023-2024 FAFSA at FAFSA.gov using 2021 income tax data. Before you start, you and a parent must each get an FSA ID at fsaid.ed.gov as you'll need them to access and sign your FAFSA.
- 2. Expect a Student Aid Report (SAR) via an email link. The SAR acknowledges that your FAFSA was received and lets you know if you need to take further action before the form can be processed.
- 3. You might receive a verification notice from the college(s) you listed on your FAFSA requesting documents to verify your FAFSA information. The college will not process your financial aid until you provide required documents.
- 4. Watch for financial aid award notifications. Once you're accepted for admission to the colleges you listed on your FAFSA, they will notify you of the types and amounts of financial aid they're offering.

Watch your email and student portal carefully for important details about admission and financial aid.

What you need to know about scholarships...Scholarship time is here! Most scholarships are based on academics, but others are based on community service, school involvement, or talent. Some are based on financial need as determined by the results of your FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid).

Here's where you can find scholarships:

- ScholarshipQuest at EducationQuest.org features over 2,000 Nebraska-based scholarships. After you create a profile, you'll be matched with scholarships that fit your criteria. You'll also find links to national sites that EducationQuest recommends.
- Your school counselor's office website. Our list of scholarships will be posted mid-February on the school website under the "School" tab and then click "Counselor." Click on the link that says "go here to my website." From there, find the Scholarship tab and they will all be listed. Make sure you 'download' the documents and save them to your computer so they stay formatted correctly. I have included a local checklist on my



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page to help you keep track of each scholarship and the requirements. This document is only for your benefit and does not need to be turned into me. Please notice due dates and requirements for each scholarship. Do not wait until the last minute to start these! If you need letters of recommendation, make sure you give your recommenders plenty of time to write a letter (a minimum two week notification is ideal)!

- The college you plan to attend. Contact the school or check the school's website for a list of scholarships they provide and application procedures.
- National search sites such as collegeboard.org, www.petersons.com/ scholarship-search.aspx, chegg.com/ scholarships

Other resources could include your coach, clubs and organizations, and your parents' employers and civic organizations.

Juniors & Parents: All juniors will be taking the ACT test at school on March 21 as part of state testing (free of charge). If you want to take an additional ACT test this spring, you must register by March 10 for the April 15 test or by May 5 for the June 10 test. To register, go online to www.actstudent.org. If you would like to request a fee waiver, contact Ms. Hermsmeier. All Meridian students have FREE access to the On To College (formerly John Baylor ACT Test Prep program). Contact Ms. Hermsmeier if you would like to take advantage of this opportunity for the spring tests! Note that all juniors will be preparing for the March 21 test using a form of ACT prep.

Juniors: it's time to find the right fit for college! Schedule a campus visit. All juniors may have two excused absences to take a college visit! Schedule your visit through the counseling office to ensure your absence is excused. In addition to your two excused days of school, your upcoming spring break is also a good time to visit schools that interest you.

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
