Meridian Public School Board of Education met on December 19, 2022, as per notice in the Fairbury Journal-News.

President Bartels called the meeting to order at 6:02 p.m. The open meeting law information was presented.

Roll call was taken: Vorderstrasse – present, Niederklein – present, Sobotkapresent, Rut – present, and Bartels –

present. Also present were Superintendent Kort and Principal Scott.

Nothing new was added to the agenda.

Sobotka moved and Niederklein seconded to excuse Scheer from the meeting. Vote taken: Vorderstrasse – aye, Niederklein – aye, Sobotka – aye, Rut – aye, and Bartels – aye. Motion passed 5-0.

No comments were heard from the public.

Vorderstrasse moved and Rut seconded to approve the consent agenda as presented.

Next Meeting was set for Monday, January 16, 2023, at 6:00 p.m.


Vorderstrasse moved and Sobotka seconded to go into closed session to discuss the negotiations of duties following the resignation of Principal

Elementary students and staff were supposed to travel to Fairbury on Wednesday, December 21, to see a movie at the Bonham Theater to celebrate the end of the semester. Due to the freezing temperatures and icy conditions, the movie was postponed until Friday, January 6.

First semester teacher observations have been completed. There are nine teachers who have been at Meridian 3 years or less who will have a second observation during the third quarter.

Teachers continue to document close reading practice for grades K-12 and number sense strategies for grades PreK -6. These are part of the strategies that are in place that have and continue to help improve student achievement.

At the end of November, I submitted my resignation as Meridian principal to Mr. Kort and the Board of Education effective at the end of December. Due to some personal family issues, it is necessary for me to be closer to home. The 1 1/2-hour commute makes it difficult for me to be close to home for emergencies. Also, my grandkids are starting to be of school age and having activities that I am missing due to commitments here at school. I have been in some form of education for the past 40 years: in the classroom teaching music and drama for 14 years, teaching in group homes and shelters for 8 years, and as an administrator for the past 18 years. I'm planning on working from home, or at least close to home. This was a difficult decision, but one I needed to make for myself and my family. Thanks to the Board of Education, Mr. Kort, teachers and staff, and members of the Meridian community for your support. I wish Meridian nothing but the best for the future, and thank you all for the past 8 1/2 years. #GoMustangs!!!

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#### **Seniors:**

- \* Many seniors are beginning to finalize their college plans. Seniors should be done at this point with applying to their top college choices. If they have not done so, they need to complete their college applications as soon as possible! The deadlines for certain scholarship applications are coming due.
- \* Local scholarship applications will be available at the end of the month. Please note that one of the biggest state scholarships is the Susan Buffett Scholarship (due February 1st). A link to this scholarship and all others are found on the "Counselor" link of the school website.
- Scholarships, scholarships, scholarships. Make an account at ScholarshipQuest to find Nebraska-

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based awards, and also check out the counselor website for the ones that Ms. Hermsmeier has received.

\* Please check my counselor website and senior classroom often for scholarship updates! Seniors, see additional information regarding the FAFSA below!

#### Juniors:

- \* Juniors interested in taking the ACT should sign up to take the February 11<sup>th</sup>, April 15<sup>th</sup>, or June 10<sup>th</sup> test. When making ACT plans, juniors should know that they will also be taking the ACT free of charge at school in March as a part of state testing. For all ACT tests other than the school test, go to www.actsutdent.org to register. If you qualify for Free & Reduced meals, you may be able to use a Fee Waiver (please see Ms. Hermsmeier for details).
- \* Juniors will also have the option to take the ACCUPLACER test at the beginning of this semester (previously known as the COMPASS test). The ACCUPLACER test is similar to the ACT but is used more as a college placement test for many two-year schools. Please sign up with Ms. Hermsmeier if you are interested.
- \* Parents... please note that Girls and Boys State applications will be out next month. If your child is interested in attending this weeklong event next summer, make sure they submit their applications.

#### **Campus Visits:**

- \* Seniors and parents: You are encouraged to make any remaining campus visits in January if possible to schools you are seriously considering attending in the fall of 2023.
- \* Juniors and parents: Don't forget that you are allowed two excused absences during your junior year to go on a campus visit! Arrangements should be made through Ms. Hermsmeier for campus visits and student sign out sheets.
- \* Forms with sample questions are available in the counselors office.

#### Seniors, complete your FAFSA:

Seniors... if you haven't done so already, it's time to complete the FAFSA! The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is the application for state, federal and college-specific financial aid. Contact Ms. Hermsmeier for more information if you

haven't already filed the FAFSA. Priority filing dates will soon be approaching! For those of you how have already completed the FAFSA, expect financial aid award notifications soon from the colleges you listed on your FAFSA. The notifications will detail the financial aid assistance the colleges are offering (could be a combination of scholarships, grants, work-study, and student loans).

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


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
