# SENIORS:

Stay on track for college by completing these second-semester tasks:

- Watch your grades. If you slack off and get poor grades, your college admission could be revoked.
- Work on the financial aid process. With all the changes in FAFSA, please read the information below to help guide you.
- Apply for scholarships. Local scholarships as well as state/regional scholarships are available on the counselor's website. You can also ScholarshipQuest see at EducationQuest.org find to Nebraska-based scholarships. You'll also find links to national scholarship sites that are EducationQuest-approved.

**Make your final college selection**. Notify the other colleges so they can take you off their mailing list.

• Be aware of deadlines to accept financial aid and college admission offers, submit your housing deposit, and register for new-student orientation.

#### **FAFSA Information:**

Federal Student Aid announced that the processing of FAFSA's will be delayed until the first half of March.

What This Means for Parents/Students

- FAFSA Submission Summaries will not be available until the first half of March.
- Families cannot make any changes to the FAFSA until they receive an email confirming the FAFSA was processed. They can then see their FAFSA Submission Summary.
- Colleges will not receive ISIRs until March, so financial aid offers will be delayed until April or May.

The good news is the tables used in the FAFSA calculations are being updated. This will increase the number of students receiving Pell Grants and the amount they receive.

#### Advice for Those Applying for Need-Based Scholarships

Keep the following correspondence as it will be all they have available to prove financial need until their FAFSA

Submission Summary is ready.

- PDF of the FAFSA confirmation page.
- PDF of the confirmation email (subject: We've Received Your FAFSA Form).
- The documents must include their first and last name and the Student Aid Index (SAI).

#### **SCHOLARSHIPS:**

Local scholarships have been updated and are available on the school website under the administration-counselor tab. Students also have all scholarships in their google classroom. Many of the scholarships are due April 15th, but students have been encouraged to start on them now. If you have questions about a scholarship, please ask! Remember, additional scholarships can be found on the counselor website, and students are encouraged to check it often! Seniors and Parents...Please make sure you inform the counseling office of any scholarships you receive.

# JUNIORS...it's time to narrow your college choices.

Narrow your college choices soon to prepare for these upcoming activities:

- ACT Test. When you take the ACT this spring, you'll be asked to provide a list of colleges that should receive your score. Note: All juniors will take the state ACT free of charge on March 26.
- Completion of the FAFSA early next fall. You and your parents can complete the FAFSA beginning October 1 of your senior year. The colleges you list on the form will receive the results.
- **College applications.** Early next fall, it will be time to apply to your top college choices. Meridian will hold an Apply2College event early next fall.

#### **IT'S COLLEGE VISIT TIME!**

Spring is a great time for juniors to take an individual tour of a college of interest! Many schools offer "Junior Visit Days," or an individual tour can be arranged. Please see Ms. Hermsmeier if you need help in setting up a visit. Remember, every junior and senior is allowed two excused absences to visit colleges. **17 AND 18 YEAR OLD MALES:** The law requires that all males must register with the Selective Service within 30 days of their 18th birthday. It is now possible to submit registration information early, as long as the person is at least 17 years and 3 months old. Selective Service will keep your information on file and process it automatically within 30 days of your 18th birthday. To find out more information go to https:// www.sss.gov. #### 2023-2024 CLASS REGISTRATION:

Over the next month. I will be meeting with each student in grades 8 -11 to register for classes for next school year. For next year's juniors and seniors, taking dual credit college classes may be an option. These students may also take college classes as part of SENCAP (Southeast Community College's Career Academy).
