Regular October 15, 2023 Meeting

Meridian Public School Board of Education met on October 15, 2023, as per notice in the Fairbury Journal-News.

Vice President Sobotka called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. The open meeting law information was presented.

Roll call was taken: Barton – present, Niederklein – present, Rut – present, and Sobotka – present. Also present were Superintendent Kort, Principal Drees and Principal Hull.

Niederklein moved and Barton seconded to excuse Bartels from the meeting. Vote taken: Barton – aye, Niederklein – aye, Rut – aye, and Sobotka – aye. Motion passed 4-0.

Nothing new was added to the agenda.

Comments were heard from the public regarding the upcoming NSAA football classification for the next two school years.

Scheer joined the meeting at 5:12 p.m.

Scheer moved and Rut seconded to approve the consent agenda as presented.

Superintendent Kort presented the Curriculum Report to the Board.

Principal Hull presented enrollment numbers and anticipated participation numbers for football at Meridian in 2024. Mr. Hull has had and will continue to visit with all boys in the $8^{th}-11^{th}$ grade to learn why the participation numbers are low. A decision needs to be made by November 30, 2023 as to whether Meridian will play six-man or eight- man football for the 2024/2025 football seasons

Rut moved and Barton seconded to approve Alex Hull as an authorized individual for financial and ordering needs for Meridian Public Schools. As such he is approved as signature at Heartland Bank, Daykin, Nebraska, for the Activity Fund (account #100-192). Vote taken: Barton – aye, Niederklein – aye, Rut – aye, Scheer – aye and Sobotka – aye. Motion passed 5-0.

Niederklein moved and Scheer seconded to approve Leslie Drees as an authorized individual for financial and ordering needs for Meridian Public Schools. As such she is approved as signature at Heartland Bank, Daykin, Nebraska, for the Activity Fund (account #100-192). Vote taken: Barton – aye, Niederklein – aye, Rut – aye, Scheer – aye and Sobotka – aye. Motion passed 5-0.

Superintendent Kort gave an update on the technology needs and how the ESSER funds have been spent. Recent purchases include smartboards, band instruments, a welder and plasma cutters.







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Superintendent Kort updated the Board on the verbal audit report received from Dana Cole. The final audit books will be available in November.

Rut moved and Scheer seconded to approve the Meridian Education Association (MEA) as negotiators for the 2025-2026 school year. Vote taken: Barton – aye, Niederklein – aye, Rut – aye, Scheer – aye and Sobotka – aye. Motion passed 5-0.

Principal Drees and Principal Hull presented the Principals' Reports to the Board.

Superintendent Kort presented Superintendent's Report to the Board.

The next regular meeting was set for Monday, November 20, 2023, at 6:00 p.m.

Niederklein moved and Scheer seconded to adjourn at 5:48 p.m. Vote taken: Barton - aye, Niederklein - aye, Rut aye, Scheer - aye and Sobotka - aye. Motion passed 5-0.


PRINCIPALLY SPEAKING WITH MR. HULL

Career Academy/Dual Credit Classes:

High school students who want to explore a career field and are interested in getting a first-hand look at what college classes will be like by taking a dual-credit college class for second semester, should check out SENCAP's Career Academy. Besides the experience gained, the other big benefit is the cost. Southeast Community College-Beatrice and Meridian will cover the full cost of tuition, which means the only cost to the student is the textbook. This option is for juniors and seniors, but sophomores can be considering the option for next year. check out https:// www.southeast.edu/sencap or talk to Ms. Hermsmeier for more information.



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Junior and Senior students also have the option of taking dual-credit college classes from Peru State College at half cost tuition price. They can also take courses through Doane University or other options that they have found. Students are encouraged to stop by Mrs. Hermsmeier's office in the next few weeks if they are interested in taking a college class second semester. Class sizes are limited, so early registration is encouraged.

EducationQuest - A Useful Tool Seniors...a reminder of what to do this fall...

There's A LOT going on right now with the financial aid and college admission processes, but don't get overwhelmed! Here's a recap of tasks you should complete this fall to stay on track to college.

- 1. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) opens in December
 - First, create an FSA ID for you and one for a parent at fsaid.ed.gov. You'll need it to access and sign the FAFSA.
 - Review our FAFSA Checklist for a list of items to gather before you start the form.
 - Complete the **FAFSA** fafsa.gov. You may also complete it via the new myStudentAid app for iOS and Android.
 - For free personal help, you can call EducationQuest to make an appointment:

2. Apply to your top college choices

- · Hopefully by now, you have some top choices for colleges. Now is a good time to apply to them! Most colleges have a free application process (exceptions are the University of Nebraska and KState), so you won't be out of anything if you apply and change your mind later on. Once you apply, let Ms. Hermsmeier know and you can be added to the Applied to College Wall. always, if you need help, stop by Mrs. Hermsmeier's office.
- 3. Retake the ACT and/or SAT. Colleges use your best scores for college admission and scholarships. Register by November 3 for the December 9 ACT.

4. Get serious about applying for scholarships. See ScholarshipQuest at EducationQuest.org for Nebraskabased scholarships and a list of national search sites. You can also visit the counselor's website off of the school website at https:// sites.google.com/meridianmustangs. org/schoolcounselor

Juniors...start researching colleges If you narrow your college choices by the end of your junior year, your senior year will be less stressful.

Here's how to get started:

- 1. Review College **Profiles** at Education Quest.org information about colleges in Nebraska and across country and/or the College Prep Handbook in the Counselors Office. If you're interested in an out-of-state school, check out the Midwest Student Exchange Program to learn about tuition discounts.
- 2. Meet with college representatives who visit your school, and then visit the websites of the colleges that interest you to learn more about the schools.
- 3. Once you've narrowed your choices, schedule campus visits. Try to visit in the spring of your junior year while colleges are still in session. Remember to get a sign -out sheet from the office BEFORE you go on your college

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
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
